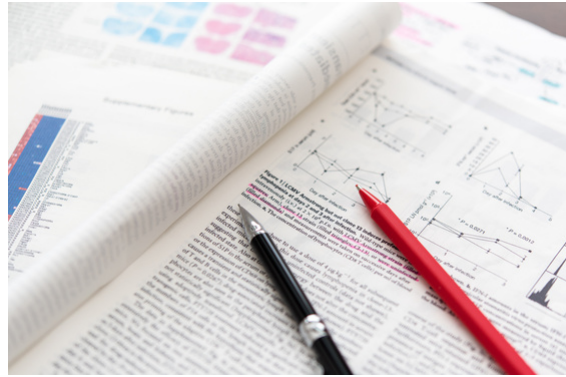
Hot Off the Press

Pennsylvania's State Correctional Facility (SCI) Pittsburgh recently completed two trials aimed at improving outcomes among inmates with severe mental illness. The first trial tested the use of candy as an incentive to increase out-of-cell time in a diversionary treatment unit. The second trial tested the use of lavender aromatherapy in a secure residential treatment unit. Both interventions showed some promise, although since neither trial used a randomized controlled design, it is difficult to draw conclusions about their effectiveness.
